4. Matters arising from previous minutes and President's report.



Consideration and approval of financial statements for 2021 & 2022 financial year:
Main income sources: Membership, CPD, Conference, royalties, and interest. Audited financial statements have been received from C2M and are available on the SAA website.
 Corrections are to be done before we sign off. Good financial position – no huge profit for the year. SARS funds were due, and this was reversed in the new year.
Question asked, will we need to settle SARS again this year? HB – Confirmed we are now up to date.
RC – Confirming the income from the conference. HB – Confirmed it is not a true reflection, as there were expenses that need to be deducte
RS – What income relates to publication? HB – refund for the publication discount.
RC – Should we include the Scorion as an income? HB – Confirmed this.
RC – Not much profit was made, what was this due to? HB – Related to various items.
AR – When will we get the final cost analysis for the conference 2022? RM and JvW - Due to additional financial administration this might take a few weeks resolve. [approximately 50k profit] This is due to the virtual and in-person conference of 2022 versus the virtual conference last year. [difference in profit]
Hanneke Brits took everybody through the income and expenses individually.
R200K profit for the year.
The end of the financial year is in the middle of the year; membership has been reflect differently. Invoice members at the beginning of the year.
Andrew Ross motioned for the approval of the audited financial statements. It was seconded Richard Cooke.



6.	Appointment of auditors for the next financial year:
	Morgy's will prepare the 1 st part of the financial statements and C2M will do the final audit. No objection was received to this, and the above appointments will therefore go ahead for the 2023 audit.
7.	Other Matter:
	RC – Considering a workshop/strategy session – for raising funds for projects. What is our position and branding, with the GATS projects?
	RM – Can we afford a marketing person?
	AR – Planetary health – should this be on the academy's agenda?
	RM – What the academy's role should be, there is an educational aspect, how do we imbed these issues? How does the academy be carbon neutral? CPD, include topics that are revenant to environmental change.
	200 Journals are going to publish simultaneously in October 2022. Klaus will co-originate with Indiran Govender. [
	RC – Example of network organization coming together, and where is the space and place for the academy partnering with others who are further down the line with strategizing with planetary health. We had an interest at WITs with Mathew Church who has completed his Ph.D. in the field, getting more involved and family medicine is a critical one.
	RM – WONCA world also has an environmental group. The University of Stellenbosch appointed a lecturer in planetary health, to tacking the research and educational issues.
	AR – We had key objectives for the three years term, planetary should be added as one of those. RM – Maybe we need to focus more on this at the next council meeting.
	AR – Active citizen, what does this mean? [Management: CEO's are not accountable] Asking whether the academy is interested in stepping up and saying the definition of unprofessional conduct should be broadened. It should not be a political issue, more are you a competent professional and should be registered as such, and can your medical association call you to account, not just for your professional conduct to patients but your professional conduct in relation to how you do your professional job, running the hospital for e.g. Is this something we want to get involved with?
	RM – The academy has been requested to take a stand on various matters over the last year, e.g., Pharmacies, ART. Written a letter to support the concerns. There is a role for the academy to express our viewpoint on the discipline that is important to the academy. We can unpack this more in the EXCO meeting.
