



From the President's Desk

Mid-April already!! There has been so much going on - I just want to highlight a few.

The FP's in private have finalized their position statement and are actively engaging with various medical aids around the issues of recognition, remuneration, access to specialist investigations and specialist formularies. The response from the medical aids has been really positive – they WANT to engage with Family Physicians – they REALLY like what we do and can see the benefit to patients and the potential cost savings from coordinated care, multimorbidity care, extended consultations, hospital at home etc. provided by FP's. Advocacy –we have continued to promote the role of the Family Physician at District hospitals and at CHCs with multiple meetings with provincial and national officials. Responses from DOH officials have generally been very positive with a recognition of the positive role that FP can play in service delivery, clinical governance and teaching. We have added our voice to those calling for appropriate funding for PHC services and have highlighted the negative impact on service delivery of the current budget cuts. In addition, as a cost cutting measure, some DOH officials have suggested that community service should be stopped. We have strongly motivated for this not to happen and have added our voice to those highlighting the negative impact that abolishing community service posts would have, particularly at rural district hospitals and, for the moment, that decision seems to be on hold.

SAAFP conference is only three months away!! The organizing committee have put together an exciting program with appeal to those in the private, public and academic sectors. We would really love to see you there AND to hear your presentations. Abstract submissions close at the end of May so... get yourselves organized and submit your abstract ASAP! We continue to hold monthly webinars on a range of topics of interest to generalists. This year we have covered topics such as allergic rhinitis, shoulder dislocation, gender affirming care and have a variety of interesting topics lined up. It is an easy way to get CPD points so join us on the last Thursday of the month from 6-7 pm. Talking about CPD points – the HPCSA have been sending out non-compliance notices to health care professionals who are behind on their CPD points. Launch of the SAAFP Research Committee
